## Music You Love. Musicians You Know. The VSA Orchestra and Chorus kicks off a season of PLAY! with four regional CELEBRATE! Sounds of Summer concerts

Montrose, CO – The Valley Symphony Association (VSA) Orchestra and Chorus kicked off its 53rd season over the first two weekends in September with four free performances that spanned the region, from Cedaredge to Montrose to Ridgway. All four shows were sponsored by concert partners Budget Blinds. Season partners are Cimarron Wealth Management and the David Mize Family.

The theme of the all-volunteer performing arts group's entire 53<sup>rd</sup> season is *PLAY!*

Sounds of Summer orchestra performances on September 7 in Cedaredge and September 8 in Montrose featured a vibrant mix of concert classics, including Sousa marches, a tip of the hat to jazz classics, the William Tell Overture, and offered a sneak peek into our upcoming concert series shows," Raper said. "We are excited to get this playful party started with another season with the VSA!"

"The VSA Chorus delighted audiences with selection that capture the wonder of summer, exploring the musings of our summer minds," VSA Chorus Conductor Katy Kristoffersen said. Their performances in Montrose on September 14 and Ridgway on September 15 included Simon and Garfunkel favorites and Louis Armstrong's "What a Wonderful World."

Since 1970, the VSA has been connecting Western Slope communities through transformative, live, musical experiences for all generations of musicians and audiences. The VSA is a regional all-volunteer performing arts organization in its 53rd season. From teens to 90-somethings, musicians from all walks of life hail from over a dozen different communities throughout the Uncompange, Grand, Gunnison, and North Fork Valleys.

"It's music you love by musicians you know," VSA Communications and Development Director Stacey Ryan said. "All of our shows feature music for all tastes—not just classical. These are really fun concerts designed for the whole family."

This year, the VSA has introduced incentivized pricing options to make their performances even more accessible to all ages. The season pass offers a "Buy Four, Get One Free" option, with prices set at \$80 for adults, \$20 for students and a family package at \$200 (two adults and two students). Single concert tickets are priced at \$20 for adults and \$5 for students, making it easier than ever to enjoy high-quality live music.
