VSA's 49th Season Opens on Sunday, October 27 Orchestra Presents "Spanish Fiesta!"

Montrose, CO – The Valley Symphony Association (VSA) presents "Spanish Fiesta!" on Sunday, October 27, 3 pm at the Montrose Pavilion.

The VSA is an all-volunteer, regional community performing arts organization in its 49th season. Its orchestra's fall concert features the beguiling, alluring, and captivating rhythms of Spain, interpreted by Spanish composers as well as Frenchman Georges Bizet, Italian Giacomo Rossini, and Russian Nikolai Rimsky-Korsakov.

The music of Spain has a long history of being sassy and classy, evoking images of sensual Flamenco dancers and fiery matadors. Spain's geographical position and history allowed for its culture to absorb musical influences from Arab, Gypsy, Jewish, African and Greek populations. As a result, "Spanish classical music lives in its own, different world apart from the bulk of traditional European classical music like Bach, Mozart, Brahms, and Beethoven," orchestra director Mike Kern said.

Spanish music has strongly informed the development of Western music, and has greatly influenced Latin American music. Spanish music is often associated with traditional styles such as flamenco and classical guitar, yet there are many different

traditional musical and dance styles across the regions. Consequently, dance strongly informs these musical genres, infusing them with rhythm. "Spanish rhythms and tonal colors are all so different from that of traditional classical music, and while it's fun to play, it's also challenging," Kern said.

The group is grateful to Montrose Memorial Hospital for stepping up to be the concert partner for the first concert of their 49th season. "Montrose Memorial Hospital believes in the power of music to bring joy and even help aid in healing," says James Kiser, CEO of Montrose Memorial Hospital. "Our music therapy program touches many patients' lives. We know our community will be lifted up by a great show from the VSA."

If you have yet to attend a concert, VSA board member Priscilla Fry encourages concert-goers to set aside the stereotype that going to a symphony performance is formal and stuffy. "It's a true mix of people. Some take advantage of the opportunity to dress up; others opt for comfortable clothes," she said. "Some enjoy the meditative aspect of a live music performance, and others see it as an opportunity to bond with multi-generations of family, meet like-minded music lovers, or take advantage of the opportunity to round out a Sunday afternoon lunch or night out at a local restaurant."

VSA concerts have sold out for the last year and half. "Buying tickets in advance guarantees a seat, and you can save by purchasing season tickets," Fry said. "It's a great way to plan for five entertaining events during the September-April time frame, or to purchase as gifts or employee incentives."

The five concerts in season 49 are designed to offer a wide range of themes that appeal to all ages. "Having a regional all-volunteer performing arts organization like ours is a rare and special thing for a community," Fry said. "We truly appreciate our season ticket holders and sponsors who help keep us in the music making business."
