VSA Debuts 50th Season with Free "Pops in the Park" Concerts

MONTROSE, CO – The Valley Symphony Association (VSA) begins its muchanticipated 50th season with free "Pops in the Park" concerts.

The regional all-volunteer performing arts organization's "Jubilee" season kicks off with concerts in Cedaredge on Saturday, September 11th and in Montrose on Sunday September 12th. Both performances begin at 5:00 PM. The Cedaredge concert in Cedaredge Town Park includes a homemade pie and ice cream social fundraiser, and the Montrose event at Riverbottom Park will feature local food trucks.

"Everyone's invited," longtime board member Priscilla Fry said. She encourages those who've never attended a VSA concert to drop any preconceived notions, and "come see what we're all about. You really only need to bring your love of music."

The VSA provides two free pops shows annually to highlight the multifaceted influence of symphonic and choral music and to encourage season ticket sales. The "Pops in the Park" events are the only outdoor performances of the season and will feature both the orchestra and chorus. Music selections will highlight contemporary music styles, including Americana, movie music, rock 'n' roll, Broadway tunes, traditional marches, and light classical pieces familiar to all. With the 20th anniversary of September 11th being observed that weekend, attendees will also enjoy a few patriotic selections as well.

Along with selling more season tickets to a more diverse demographic, the group is looking to attract new sponsors and volunteers to support the organization, "to keep us in the music-making business," Fry said.

"We are extremely grateful for all of our season partners including Our Town Matters for sponsoring the Pops in the Park events," stated Hartland Clubb Jr., president of the VSA board.

"Having a regional all-volunteer arts organization such as the VSA is a rare and special thing for a community," Clubb said.
