



## STEVEN AGUILÓ-ARBUES Orchestra Guest Conductor

The April *Pop Stars & Superheroes* concerts will be guest conducted by Steven Aguiló-Arbues, who earned his professional studies certificate and master of music degree from the Manhattan School of Music in New York City. He has an active career as a conductor, chorus master, vocal coach, recitalist, and producer, and has performed as a solo and collaborative pianist throughout Spain, Italy, Peru and the United States, including Carnegie Hall in New York City. Aguiló-Arbues has had the privilege of studying under notable conducting pedagogues including Larry Rachleff (Rice University), David Effron (Indiana University), Edoardo Müller (Metro-

politan Opera) and David Gilbert (New York Philharmonic). In 2016, he was chosen as an orchestral conducting fellow with the Miami Music Festival.

"Music has the power to engage the mind, stir the heart, and reinvigorate the soul, no matter your age," Aguiló-Arbues said. "I feel privileged to make great music with the VSA musicians and have fun sharing it with the community."

His love for opera has led him to work on over 70 productions throughout the United States and Italy. He has coached singers who have gone on to sing with opera companies around the world, including the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. Conducting engagements during the 2022/2023 season include concerts with Denver's Inside the Orchestra, the Central City Opera, Boulder Opera, and Opera Fort Collins. Recent positions include artistic director and conductor for The Renaissance Project Choir (Boulder, CO), music director for Boulder Opera, and program/music director of studio artists at Sarasota Opera, and being appointed to artistic director of Opera Fort Collins.

## KATY KRISTOFFERSEN Chorus Conductor

Katy Kristoffersen's 20 years of experience in coaching, accompanying, conducting, and teaching are backed by undergraduate degrees in music and psychology (Miami University, OH) and a master's in music education (College of Mount St. Joseph).

Enamored by music from the start, at 2 she was reaching for the piano to emulate her talented older siblings. She started composing piano pieces at 4 and

accompanying church choirs by 12.

As an undergrad, Katy had the great privilege of studying with Dr. Ethan Sperry, a world-renowned name in the choral and world-music spheres. He helped to draw out her confidence as an arranger and composer. Katy dated Mike Kristoffersen (contrabass) throughout college, which led to her accompanying every single string bass player in the university. She also caught the eye of bass professor, Dr. Steve Ullery, who requested that she accompany his recital as well as the great Edgar Meyer when he visited to teach a master class.

"Accompanist" is a good metaphor for Katy's skillset, although "joyful forklift" is apt, too. Katy thrives when in service of elevating people around her. This energy has drawn her to stretch her skills outward in several directions: through the lens of music (choral direction, music director, private teacher, music educator, accompanist), and through the lens of mindfulness (teaching her original curriculum to corporate and government agencies, private coaching, and starting her own mindfulness course with Mike).

When not hopping from one responsibility to the next, you might find Katy and Mike trail running near their Ridgway home, hiking with their kids, or just sitting outside in the awe and beauty that drew them here in the first place.

Concertmaster


Sandy grew up in Colorado Springs, CO, in a family of musicians. She was involved in orchestras, choirs, and bands throughout her youth, and earned her bachelor of music in education with an instrumental major and choral minor from Arizona State University. Sandy has taught band, choir, and orchestra in all levels of education, elementary through college.

In 2010, she and her family moved to Grand Junction. Sandy is a violinist with the Grand Junction Symphony Orchestra (GJSO), High Desert Opera, and Rockestra, and has an active private studio teaching violin, viola, and cello. Her quartet performs in churches and for area events, and she plays in regional gigs, performs regularly in Aspen for summer weddings, and is a recurring violin coach for Camp Con Brio. Sandy adjudicates for the District 51 Solo/Ensemble, local auditions, and judged the Colorado West Invitational Music Festival in 2013. She was an active member of the GJSO Board for many years and served on their music director search committee.

In 2013, she started as a paraprofessional in Mesa County School District. Sandy assists orchestras at several middle schools, and in 2014, she was a long-term sub for choirs at a local high school.

Sandy and her husband have two daughters, a son, and three grandchildren. They absolutely love living in Grand Junction: the people, surrounding views, and connections they've made.

What is a concertmaster? The concertmaster is the principal or "first chair" violinist who leads the orchestra in its tuning prior to the concert and customarily plays all violin solos within pieces. The concertmaster also marks the orchestra's scores with the appropriate bowings to ensure all the violinists are moving and playing in unison, offers suggestions to other string sections, and translates instructions from the conductor into specific technical language for strings.

#### FEATURED MUSICIAN Stacey Ryan - Clarinet

Stacey hasn't missed a concert since joining the VSA in January 2010. She started on bass clarinet, and in 2015, after long-time principal clarinetist Larry Sims retired, she switched to B-flat clarinet.

Born and raised in Tracy, CA, an ag town that was about the size of Delta, she and her dad connected through music and dance. "He has a wonderful baritone voice, played euphonium in school, and taught me to swing dance by having me stand on his shoes when I was little." She relocated to Montrose in July, 2007, with then fiancé Seth Ryan, who sings in the VSA Chorus as his schedule allows. They were married at the Beaumont Hotel in Ouray the following June. Both her dad and Seth sang to and danced with her at the wedding.



When Stacey was in the 3rd grade, her mom bought the clarinet that Stacey still plays for a whopping \$50. "What a screaming deal! It turned out to be a top-of-the-line instrument!" In summer school that year, Joe E. Foster, who became her high school band director, taught her to play. In high school she studied under Dr. William C. Dominik, clarinet professor at the Conservatory of Music at University of the Pacific (Stockton, CA). A four-year member of the county honor band, she was also selected as a member of the prestigious symphonic level bands of all California All-State Honor Bands available (there are multiple) all four years (a rare accomplishment), and entered UCLA on a music scholarship in 1983.

After dropping the major, she didn't play for 25 years. "I'd occasionally try, squeak and squawk, and figured I'd 'lost my chops.' When I was encouraged to join the Montrose Community Band for their 2009 Christmas concert, I feared my horn wouldn't cooperate. Then Larry discovered a nasty split, and SuperGlue was the answer! The concert proved a tearful surprise for my folks who were visiting, as they hadn't seen me on stage in 25 years." As for the hiatus. "It was shocking how fast my muscle memory returned, which bodes well for anyone who would like to dust off their instrument case and join us!"

Stacey holds a bachelor of arts degree from UCLA and a graduate certificate in computer programming from DU. Her varied career, personal and professional connections, and jack-of-all trades skill set led the VSA Board to approach her in 2018 to handle a few freelance marketing duties, which quickly expanded in scope. Since then, she has consulted as the VSA's director of communications and development. Stacey works to build. cultivate, and solidify meaningful, long-lasting in-kind and financial partnerships that are important and strategic to both giver and the VSA. Simply stated: she gets the word out, identifies potential matches, finds common ground, and builds partnerships, all which serves to support the VSA's immediate and long-term health while upholding the organizational culture of bringing classical music to life on the Western Slope.

#### **OUR HISTORY: BRINGING CLASSICAL MUSIC TO LIFE!**

In 1970 a small group of classical musicians met in the parlor of Wilma and Charles Lowell's Eckert home. By 1982, there were 30 musicians practicing once a week in Delta and performing four annual concerts. Over the years, the group has progressed, growing in size and musical ability.



In the late 1990s and early 2000s, the Grand Mesa Singers and the Christmas in the Valley Chorus were seasonal contributors, mainly at Christmas concerts. In 2002, these choral groups combined, and the Valley Symphony Orchestra (VSO) became the Valley Symphony Association (VSA) to include both orchestra and chorus.

Today, over 100 VSA performers will once again bring their skill, passion, and talent to the stage. They live and work in our midst, represent the North Fork, Uncompahgre, and Grand Valleys, and hail from throughout Montrose, Ouray, Hotchkiss, Eckert, Olathe, Palisade, Paonia, Delta, Ridgway, Austin, Cedaredge, and Grand Junction. Our musicians are teachers, parents, neighbors, students. They have jobs. They have children. They have homes and schedules and commitments. They teach at local colleges, high schools, middle schools, and elementary schools. They work in business, the arts, government, agriculture, law enforcement, and health care. Some are retired. Some are entrepreneurs. Some are military veterans. Some are snowbirds. Some are teenagers. And they are all VSA musicians.



## FEATURED MUSICIAN Christian Pfretzschner – Bass Trombone

"Unlike the talented and lovely musicians of our orchestra, I didn't have a life of lessons or pursue a music degree. I just never set down my instrument." Christian's musical journey began in fifth grade. "Faced with the choice of band or choir, I wanted to play an instrument. However, after the two years of piano lessons that little kids get, I was convinced I had slow fingers. That ruled out all instruments except the shoulder-mounted slide whistle."

"To continue playing after high school, I either needed to build the high range of the tenor trombone or specialize on a more obscure instrument. I couldn't get the high notes at the time, so my parents gave me a bass trombone for graduation."

In college Christian fell in love with the band Jethro Tull and spent a summer learning the flute. "Turns out my fingers aren't so slow after all." He played flute for experimental rock bands Thetans and Order of the Golden Mirror. "They were loads of fun."

He helped start the Backyard Brass during the coronavirus pandemic. "While bored in 2020, I was brainstorming safe, productive things to do. Brass are outdoor instruments, not civilized chamber instruments. (The word trombone is never used in polite society.) We can even perform outside! I gathered some symphony brass players and made a few new friends to assemble a brass quintet. We rehearsed in each other's backyards. We couldn't hold a public gathering, but we could play for assisted care facilities. We've since played for a school, Christmas events, and Oktoberfest."

With the VSA Orchestra since 2012, Christian loves the rehearsals. "It's the opportunity to make mistakes and grow with the music. The pieces you love become your friends. You find new favorites."

"Performing music teaches this life lesson: the best seats are on stage."

## FEATURED MUSICIAN Sam Kevan - Tenor I

Sam's interest in singing began around age 7-8 when he became part of his church children's choir. His family moved to Hansen, ID, into a house that contained a 1918 upright player piano. While his father enjoyed pumping the pedals to play his favorite "Turkey in the Straw," Sam started piano lessons. Six years later he made his first career decision regarding music. "Rather than two hours a day practicing with a concert pianist, I decided on medicine rather than music for a career. I wanted a more normal teenage life that included sports."

While he played trombone in the school band, he discovered that he had an ear for harmony and tried out bass, baritone, and tenor parts singing camp songs with his high school church youth group. He joined a barbershop chorus in Lewistown, MT, in 1978, and continued with this genre when he moved to Delta in 1981: he's a 40-year member of the Black Canyon Barbershop Chorus. He sang tenor in the barbershop quartet "The Sound Production" for a number of years and the baritone lead in the quartet "Fourmata."

He thanks his involvement with the VSA Chorus for the majority of his education in vocal singing. "A director of the chorus, in addition to preparing a great performance, has the opportunity to both teach and model vocal singing technique." In 1982, he sang with various regional choruses, and when he moved back to the area in 2000, he rejoined these groups that would together become the VSA Chorus in 2002.

Sam continues to enjoy singing in the VSA chorus and his church choir, and recently started playing his trombone in the Cedaredge Community Band. He has been part-time pianist and organist for the Delta United Methodist Church for the last 25-30 years. In addition to making music, he enjoys traveling with his wife, Lana, to visit their 10 grandchildren, Rotary, gardening, making wine, and exercising by walking, biking, and hiking.
