DEDICATION

Larry Sims

Montrose native Larry Sims began playing clarinet in elementary school. He was drum major for two years at Montrose High School, where he also began to learn about and love jazz and acquired his first saxophone. In college at Western State, Larry majored in business and continued clarinet study, played in bands, and enjoyed leading dance bands which traveled across the Western Slope for gigs.



After college, Larry spent a couple of years as the morning disc jockey at KUBC radio and then joined his father in the Homer L. Sims Agency on Main Street, Montrose, in 1971. Music took a back seat for a few years. When Larry was asked to organize a band concert for the Montrose Centennial in 1982, he stepped into his avocation of providing "...music for all occasions" with The Village Jazz Band. Their business card indicated they were available for "...Weddings, Funerals, Hangings, Church Socials, Bar Brawls, Barn Raisings, Love-Ins and Other Festive Occasions." He described it as "A Mostly Dixieland sort of Band with a Happy Sound!" Many will remember the popular series of big band concert he put on at the Pavilion in the early 2000s.

Larry joined the VSA Orchestra in 1993 and first soloed in 1994. Through the years, he was soloist three additional times, playing music of Weber, Mozart, Baermann and Rossini. His final performance in 2014 was of Krommer's *Concerto for Two Clarinets* with clarinetist Holly (Ray) Burgess by his side.

Joining the VSA board of directors in 1997, Larry was soon writing program notes, selling program advertising, advertising his own business in the program, and recording the orchestra's concerts. He worked on publicity and served as the organization's historian. He played principal clarinet in the orchestra through 2015, when he and his wife, Janet, moved to Boise, Idaho. Larry donated his A clarinet to the VSA in 2022.

Janet beats Larry's longevity with the VSA Orchestra by a few years (1980-2006), playing violin and acting as chorus accompanist and rehearsal pianist for operas and operettas. She was also chorus director for many performances of *Messiah*.

The VSA dedicates this year's Christmas by Candlelight concerts to Larry Sims, who played—literally and figuratively—instrumental roles for the VSA from 1993-2015. His influence resonates throughout the organization, and we are indebted and grateful to his generosity on the stage as well as behind it.

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Our 51st season launched in September and introduced a new performance schedule of quarterly concerts that will include both Saturday and Sunday offerings at the Montrose Pavilion. Both the orchestra and chorus will share the stage for all shows this season.

We are thrilled to announce that the orchestra conductor search committee has narrowed the field of finalists from throughout the US and Europe to three individuals: Troy Raper from Grand Junction CO, Charlotte Ruth Harrison from Orem UT, and Steven Aguiló-Arbues from Denver CO. Each finalist will guest conduct the orchestra at one of the two-concert performances in December (Raper), February (Harrison), and April (Aguiló-Arbues).

The search committee is made up of VSA musician members and chaired by Charles Latshaw, music director of the Grand Junction Symphony Orchestra and Flagstaff Symphony Orchestra. "It has been a thorough process, vetting candidates to take the helm of the VSA," Latshaw said. The committee has been working since June, receiving applications, reviewing conducting videos, and interviewing candidates. "The transition from one conductor to another is a great opportunity for the community to evaluate its musical priorities, and choose the person to best take the VSA from where it is to where we want it to be in the future. All three of these candidates have great potential to thrive and grow with the VSA."

Part of the selection process will be encouraging audience input immediately following each performance. As an incentive to participate, a beautiful hand-painted violin will be awarded as the prize in a drawing that will highlight our orchestra conductor search (see page 31 for more information).

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD continued

Audience members who complete a guest conductor survey at any of the December, February, and April concerts will be entered into the drawing that will take place at the final April concert. Feedback will be compiled to help the committee reach a decision in May, when they expect to announce the new conductor.

We hope you will be excited to attend all three shows and participate in this important process. This decision is a vital one—one that will help us continue to bring classical music to life on the Western Slope.

TROY RAPER Orchestra Guest Conductor

Musician and educator Troy Raper is a Colorado native. He began his teaching career in 1988 and is in his first year of retirement after 31 years in education. Raper received his bachelor's in music education from the University of Northern Colorado, where he graduated with honors, and his master's degree in education from Lesley University with an emphasis in educational technology.

During his long career, Raper's school orchestras were consistently awarded superior ratings at music festivals from Palisade to Disneyland. Many former students are now accomplished professional teachers and performers around the country.

As an active advocate for teaching in Colorado, Raper spent 10 years as chair/board member for the Colorado All State Orchestra Governing Board. He has also served as a board member of the Colorado Chapter of the American String Teachers Association, and as a member of the Colorado Music Educators Association state board. Troy currently serves as production manager and librarian to the Grand Junction Symphony Orchestra.

As a member of the musical community on the Western Slope, Raper has spent countless hours developing and nurturing a community of former students, colleagues, and professional relationships. He believes in the accessibility of music to everyone: from the youngest students to professionals, there is a place for everyone in the arts.







SANDRA SUNDSTROM Concertmaster




In 2010, she and her family moved to Grand Junction. Sandy is a violinist with the Grand Junction Symphony Orchestra (GJSO), High Desert Opera, and Rockestra, and has an active private studio teaching violin, viola, and cello. Her quartet performs in churches and for area events, and she plays in regional gigs, performs regularly in Aspen for summer weddings, and is a recurring violin coach for Camp Con Brio. Sandy adjudicates for the District 51 Solo/Ensemble, and local auditions, and judged the Colorado West Invitational Music Festival in 2013. She was an active member of the GJSO Board for many years and served on their music director search committee.

In 2013, she started as a paraprofessional in Mesa County School District. Sandy assists orchestras at several middle schools, and in 2014, she was a long-term sub for choirs at a local high school.

Sandy and her husband have two daughters, a son, and three grandchildren. They absolutely love living in Grand Junction: the people, surrounding views, and connections they've made.

What is a concertmaster? The concertmaster is the principal or "first chair" violinist who leads the orchestra in its tuning prior to the concert and customarily plays all violin solos within pieces. The concertmaster also marks the orchestra's scores with the appropriate bowings to ensure all the violinists are moving and playing in unison, offers suggestions to other string sections, and translates instructions from the conductor into specific technical language for strings.







OUR HISTORY: BRINGING CLASSICAL MUSIC TO LIFE!

In 1970 a small group of classical musicians met in the parlor of Wilma and Charles Lowell's Eckert home. By 1982, there were 30 musicians practicing once a week in Delta and performing four annual concerts. Over the years, the group has progressed, growing in size and musical ability.



In the late 1990s and early 2000s, the Grand Mesa Singers and the Christmas in the Valley Chorus were seasonal contributors, mainly at Christmas concerts. In 2002, these choral groups combined, and the Valley Symphony Orchestra (VSO) became the Valley Symphony Association (VSA) to include both orchestra and chorus.

Today, over 100 VSA performers will once again bring their skill, passion, and talent to the stage. They live and work in our midst, represent the North Fork, Uncompahgre, and Grand Valleys, and hail from throughout Montrose, Ouray, Hotchkiss, Eckert, Olathe, Palisade, Paonia, Delta, Ridgway, Austin, Cedaredge, and Grand Junction. Our musicians are teachers, parents, neighbors, students. They have jobs. They have children. They have homes and schedules and commitments. They teach at local colleges, high schools, middle schools, and elementary schools. They work in business, the arts, government, agriculture, law enforcement, and health care. Some are retired. Some are entrepreneurs. Some are military veterans. Some are snowbirds. Some are teenagers. And they are all VSA musicians.

O Magnum Mysterium captures the absolute wonder of the animals and shepherds during their adoration of the Virgin birth. Morten Lauridsen's setting is magnificent, humble, and deeply personal.

Listen for the fascinating chords as the chorus sings, *Some Children See Him*, arranged by renowned vocal jazz composer Yumiko Matsuoka Young. The text explores the ways that children all over the world see the baby Jesus in their own eyes, looking just like them.

And I double-dog dare you to NOT tap your foot during *Pat-a-pan*! The title and text create its own drum-like rhythm which is scattered throughout the song.





FEATURED MUSICIAN Vince Farnsworth - Violin 2

A former research scientist at Caltech in Pasadena, CA, Vince Farnsworth worked in the biological sciences inventing and developing analytical instrumentation, and he holds "20 or so" patents. He was active as a hobbyist with the highly respected Ventura County Astronomical Society, where he learned to photograph deep space images. It is his love of photography—especially the types of otherworldly, deep space imagery revealed through the use of telescopes—that has turned into a second career.

Since retiring to Montrose in 2006 with wife Maggie, Vince has become a well-known, respected, and sought-after landscape photographer and astrophotographer of Western night skies. Many consider him to be the premier photographer of the internationally renowned dark skies of Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park. He's the author of *Getting Up Early: The Visitor's Guide to Photographing the Black Canyon*. He even discovered a natural phenomenon visible during early mornings in spring and summer at the Black Canyon in April 2012. He and park rangers named his find *Dragon's Tonque*.

It's the balance between the artistic and the technical, the creative and the scientific, that drew him to the field—and that also led to him invent a new piece of equipment in 2011: the BluPano. Manufactured in Montrose and made of blue anodized aluminum, it's an adapter used in panoramic photography to correct parallax error, the distortion that occurs when photographing images that include objects both near and far, and is used in night sky photography, when elements of a landscape are included. Night sky photographers the world over owe Vince a debt of gratitude.

Since settling in Montrose, he and Maggie have opened several photography-related businesses. Vince's photos hang in many local businesses, including the Pavilion lobby—check them out! The couple currently owns two photo art galleries—one located at Montrose Center For Arts (11 S Park Ave)—where he enjoys meeting lots of interesting people from all over the world.

Vince got his start in music playing the clarinet in middle and high school. In college, he taught himself to play guitar. It wasn't until 20 years ago that he started taking violin lessons. He has been playing with various groups for the past 19 years, and joined the VSA Orchestra in 2013. "I love classical music, and being a part of a performing symphony orchestra is definitely a highlight of my life!"

DISCOVERING OUR ROOTS


Volunteer orchestral and choral groups like the VSA are an outcropping from the concept of the American community band, which predates the Civil War. Immigrants brought the band tradition with them to the US, where thousands of ordinary citizens participated in these ensembles.

After the Civil War, census figures indicated that, across the country, there were about 10,000 community bands. Town bands were admired and provided townspeople with popular, light entertainment for concerts. While the quality of performance varied, the enjoyment and value to each town's social and cultural climate is undeniable.

Community bands experienced a great dying out after World War I, victims of a cultural shift to mass media, radio, and more, all which led to a rise in school music programs. The increased number of musicians who learned an instrument and played in high school and college bands but did not pursue music as a career also provided a rich pool of amateur talent seeking an outlet for their musical abilities. As a result—and ironically—there was once again a rise in participation in community bands.

While there will always be music teachers and professional musicians participating in volunteer music performance groups like the VSA, the majority of members come from professions that are not related to music. Most are amateurs who enjoyed playing in school and missed the camaraderie and music-making. Others are students looking to gain more rehearsal time and learn from more experienced musicians.

These ensembles give *everyone*, regardless of their age or chosen career path, a place to play their instrument, contribute to their community, and most especially, to enjoy themselves while making music.
